PUBLIC NOTICE TO REISSUE UPDES PERMIT

**PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

**BACKGROUND**

The Chamberlain Investment Company (CIC) is a proposed spa resort which may include a restaurant and greenhouses as well as grottos and swimming pools. The State Engineer's office has issued a non-consumptive water right to CIC. This water right cannot exceed 1.00 cubic feet per second (.65 million gallons a day or 724 acre feet annually). The only additive to the water prior to the discharge will be chlorine for disinfection purposes as mandated by the Utah Department of Health.
