Staker Parson Companies created a stand-alone Environmental Department in 1996, in recognition of the importance of complying with applicable environmental regulations. As time progressed, the department grew to three full time employees including an executive level position. Assessing potential impacts and developing programs to achieve compliance have been the main focus of the department. Environmental audits are performed to support this goal. In 2007, Staker Parson Companies developed a formalized Environmental Management System. The EMS includes a policy statement, document tracking and management database, identification of significant aspects, establishment of environmental metrics, regulatory and social impact auditing, management accountability, employee training and neighbor outreach programs. The quantifiable environmental metrics demonstrate a marked improvement in environmental performance since the program was started. Since 2007, the average compliance audit score has improved by over 20%. By 2010, nearly half of all sites audited scored above 90%. The Staker Parson Companies EMS system was recognized in 2009 by the Utah Manufacturers Extension Partnership as "Manufacturer of the Year - Environmental Consciousness". Staker Parson Companies has seen how implementing an EMS improves compliance, and supports systems that are tailored to the individual industry. Applications are accepted at any time and will be reviewed on a semi-annual basis.

Each Clean Utah Silver Level participant will develop and implement an Environmental Management System (EMS). Several EMS models currently exist, including ISO-14001, and the applicant is free to select the model which best meets the facility's circumstances. Any model selected must include each of the 12 components outlined in the Clean Utah policy (available online at www.deq.utah.gov/cleanutah).

To remain in the program, an EMS must be completed and operational within two years of being accepted into the program. Those who desire to move onto the Gold Level must document that the EMS has been implemented for one full cycle. In addition, two projects designed to significantly reduce or prevent pollution must be proposed. Ideally, these projects should be based on aspects identified in the EMS process (additional information is available online).




